Naval 8 P 20 In the New Year promotions list Mackenzie went up to Flt Cdr , and Thom, Booker, Compston, Wood, Todd and Grange to Flt Lts

Naval Aces P22 On 4 Jan 17 Grange was leading Little and Flt Sub Lt (Flt Lt) Allan Todd when they dived on 7 Albatross D IIs. Grange claimed an enemy aircraft destroyed and 2 OOC, but 3 Albatros scouts got on Todd's tail. Little, coming to his assistance, saw Todd twist to the left and lose his left wings. As both sides retired, Little observed a crowd gathered around Todd's Pup, while a German aeroplane lay on its back nearby and 2 others had forced landed in an adjacent field.

Grange got credit for all 3 claims, although Jasta 'Boelcke' opponents suffered no casualties. Todd had been slain by Lt Manfred von Richthofen, who cut serial N5187 from the fighter's fuselage for his trophy collection and submitted his own report of the action:

"About 1615 hrs, just starting out, we saw above us at 400 metres altitude 4 aeroplanes, unmolested by our artillery. Only when they were approaching did we notice that they were English. One of the English aeroplanes attacked us, and we saw immediately that the enemy aeroplane was superior to ours. Only because we were 3 against one did we detect the enemies' weak points. I managed to get behind him and shot him down. The aeroplane broke apart whilst falling.
